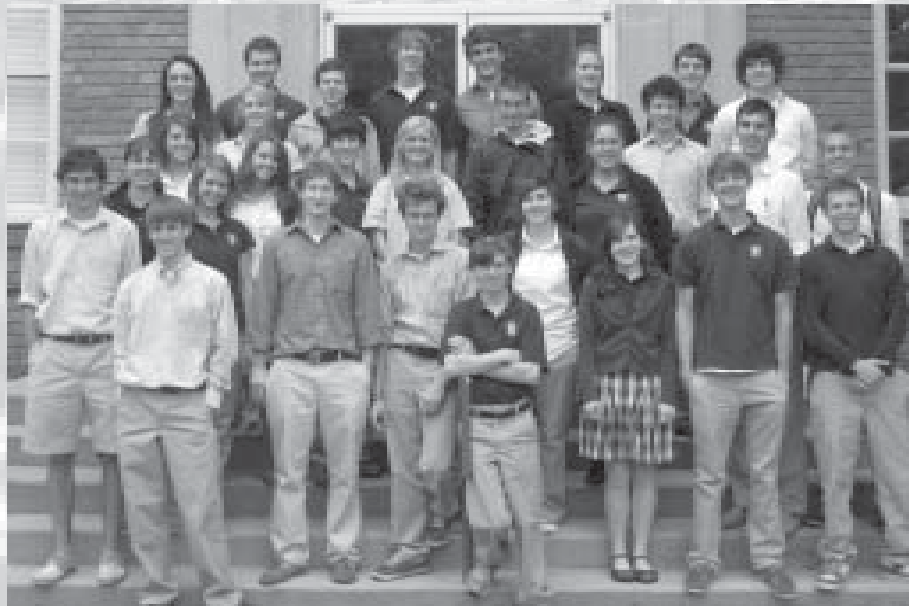

As I consider the hydrangeas, I am reminded of Veritas students. On Saturday, May 29, we celebrated the end of our twelfth year, our sixth commencement ceremony, and the achievements of the graduating class of 2010. Twenty-seven students walked across the stage to receive a diploma, a piece of paper recognizing years of hard work, the acquisition of an impressive degree of knowledge, and the attainment of a significant milestone.

The Class of 2010 is unique in many ways.

- It is the largest graduating class in Veritas' history.
- It contained five students who attended Veritas for First Grade through Twelfth Grade, experiencing a complete classical Christian education.
- The Valedictorian and Salutatorian were also National Merit Scholars.
- Four students received full scholarships to a college or university.
- Nine of them were active participants as seniors in Theatre Veritas, delighting us with their dramatic skills and musical talents.
- Seventeen of them were members of our athletic teams and exhibited skill and sportsmanship in each competition.

While the Class of 2010 was unique in the above areas, they also evidenced abilities and attributes that we have observed in previous graduating classes and which we trust will characterize all future Veritas graduates.

- They have received a firm foundation in the study of truth, God's Word.
- Each one of them will enter higher education during the three months following graduation.
- They are attending a wide variety of colleges and universities, because they possess differing gifts and goals.
- They have studied a classical liberal arts curriculum, utilizing logic and rhetoric to gain understanding and to express ideas in speech and writing as well as through art, music, and drama. Therefore, they are embarking upon the future with the tools required to mature as learners and leaders who impact their culture for Christ.

Our mission remains the same: “Intelligent Faith: Equipping minds and engaging hearts for God's Kingdom purposes.” Veritas students, like my hydrangeas, possess individual traits that make them distinct while sharing a common ground, which unifies them. They, likewise, need to be steeped in rich soil for an adequate time in order to evidence the colors that are unique to them. We endeavor to provide a Christ-centered, stimulating environment, in which each student's gifts and talents can be unveiled and nurtured, enabling each one to play a vital role in God's perfect plan for His creation.

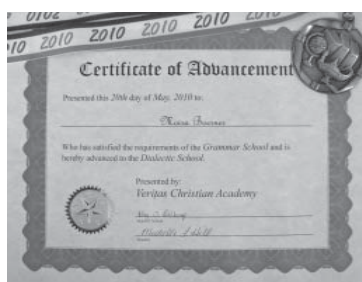

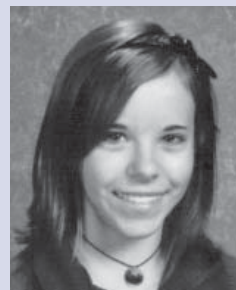

Pigfest

At the end of each quarter, Veritas has a half day of school. Instead of cramming another morning's worth of classes into this time, the Veritas High and Middle School students use this time to approach the goals of the school from different, and more creative, angles.

For two years the High School students have been spending these half-days in an event called PigFest. The concept of PigFest is old (although the name is borrowed from a contemporary group), but it is a practice that needs to be revived in the modern world. Simply, PigFest is eating together with the purpose of discussing significant and weighty issues. Modern Americans are content to go through much of life without discussing and arguing through important ideas, because it is hard work to challenge one another and be challenged. Many of our conversations are merely regurgitating and reporting what we have heard and seen, rather than searching for the core concepts in an event and arguing about the merits, virtues, and vices of those concepts. Our ideas need to be refined, clarified, and changed, because how we live and what we do is dependent upon what we think and feel about issues in the world. We act based on our understanding, and when we have a shallow understanding of an important issue, we act poorly.

PigFest seeks to rectify this, by giving the people involved a safe place to argue and talk about what really matters over a meal. The act of eating together while talking is important, because eating reveals vulnerability, in that food exposes our needs and lack of control, and enables a sense of community, because the participants are all at the same table, sharing their vulnerability and desires.

Throughout history great leaders have participated in groups like this, and in most instances, the group was purposefully arranged. Occasionally the groups came together naturally, but normal people need to remind themselves, their friends, and their families to talk about what really matters. The people who have purposefully done this have not only taught themselves to argue and discuss with grace and enjoyment, but they have also changed the world. Two examples of that fact are William Wilberforce and Benjamin Franklin. Both orchestrated groups that ate together for the purpose of discussing real issues, and in both instances, the discussions spilled over and profoundly impacted the world around them.

True PigFest societies refuse to let their members remain at superficial knowledge of a subject, but they also refuse to let the members remain at a theoretical understanding. The final question of the meal is always, "So what should we now do?" Given that the model of Classical education is relevant and expansive knowledge first, deep understanding second, and wise application third, PigFest blends beautifully into the curriculum and goals of Veritas. We spend a morning accomplishing a great deal, because our students learn to eat and argue together, but are then challenged to apply their new understanding.

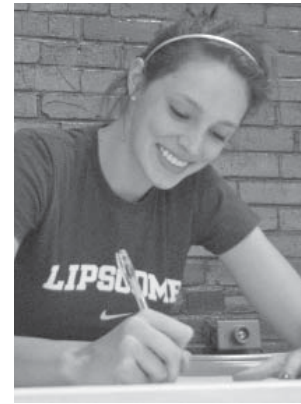

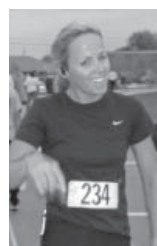
